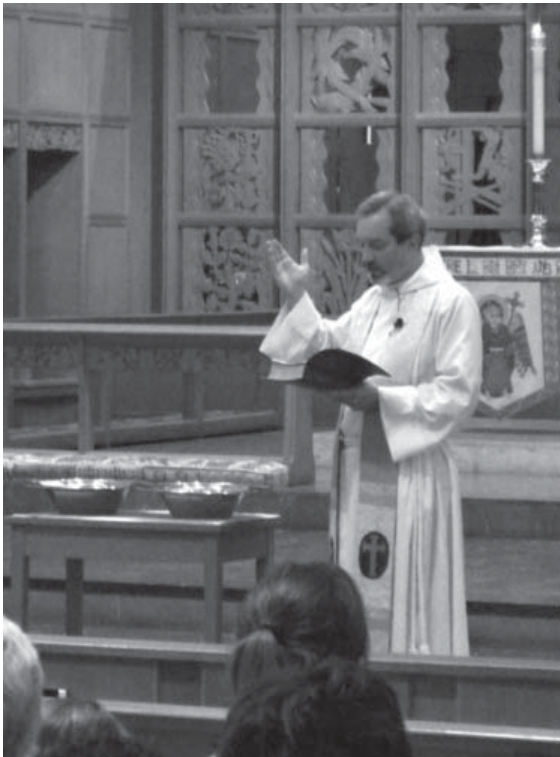


## Institutional (Heart)

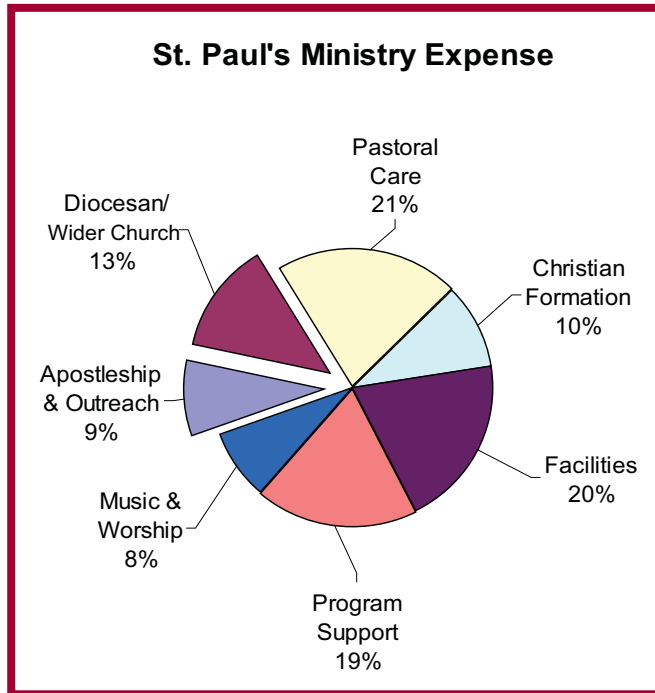
St. Paul's is where we are united in marriage, confirmed in our faith, and comforted in distress or grief.

Last year's shortfall resulted from an unexpected decrease in giving at year's end while expenses were within budget. The leadership has trimmed the budget for 2009 while still trying to maintain our current ministries. We still forecast a shortfall, which will require a 10% increase in our annual pledged income to balance the budget. We know not everyone is able to increase their pledge, and we know some may do more. Will you prayerfully consider a generous increase this year?
